COVID-19 (Coronavirus)

As I am sure you have been, MPS is closely following the information being released on the spread of COVID-19 (Coronavirus). Midland Public Schools is placing a special emphasis on how this may spread and impact schools. The best resource available for information is the Center for Disease Control (CDC).

Presently, there is no anti-viral treatment that attacks the coronavirus. It is vital we rely on prevention similar to the H1N1 (swine flu) in 2009. As schools follow guidance from the CDC on specific strategies for schools, we will follow common sense strategies for preventing the spread of communicable diseases. Such as:

- ✓ Practice keeping distance from each other when ill
- ✓ Parents need to keep children who exhibit cold and flu-like symptoms home and see a health professional
- Encourage children/students to keep hands off mouth and eyes
- \checkmark Use anti-bacterial soap and wash hands frequently
- ✓ Review proper hand washing techniques
- \checkmark Discouraging sharing of food and beverages
- ✓ MPS has and will continue to increase our level of cleaning in schools and use products that are proven effective
- \checkmark MPS will be vigilant in monitoring illness in our schools
- Currently there are no recommendations of closing schools from federal, state or local levels, but we will always keep this as an option if our State or local area sees confirmed cases

MPS monitors student daily absence rates for a variety of reasons. One reason is to be proactive if we see increased rates of illness. MPS has not seen any increased absence rates at this time. All of our schools have maintained attendance rates at 90% or higher (which is normal for February). Today (Friday, February 28) we have a very good district attendance rate of 94%.
