2020-21 MPS Student Learning Options Chosen

Semester 1

- → 60% chose face-to-face (F2F) learning
- → 40% chose full or partial (hybrid) virtual learning

Semester 2

- → 80% chose face-to-face (F2F) learning
- → 20% chose full or partial (hybrid) virtual learning

Miscellaneous Info, Facts & Figures

- → MPS celebrated 590 graduates in 2021
- → MPS implemented intensive COVID protocols
- Free meals were available for ALL F2F & virtual students
- → Music classes were held with safety protocols
- → MHSAA & middle school athletics took place as allowed by the State, with safety protocols

Out of the 180 school days in the 2020-21 school year, students in F2F learning were in school

Elementary: 170 days Middle School: 161 days HH Dow HS: 135 days Midland HS: 140 days

The remaining days F2F students attended virtually Only two snow days were used (February 16 & 22)

- → Students earned numerous awards and honors while competing/performing virtually

- → As we released a couple of months ago in the 2021-22 school year calendar, the first day of school is set for Monday, August 23.
- → While we don't have a crystal ball, given the current COVID trends, we anticipate masks & safety protocols won't need to be as strict as 2020-21. However, those who wish to continue to use them will be welcome to do so.
- → Student support specialists will be in place to assist students with social/emotional wellbeing.
- → Certificated educational interventionists will be in place to support students who have experienced learning loss in the past year and a half.
- → Virtual learning opportunities will still be available for high school students.

JUNETEENTH

"Juneteenth, also called Emancipation Day or Juneteenth Independence Day, is a holiday commemorating the end of slavery in the United States, observed annually on June 19. In 1863, during the American Civil War, President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation, which declared more than three million enslaved people living in the Confederate states to be free. More than two years would pass, however, before the news reached African Americans living in Texas. It was not until Union soldiers arrived in Galveston, Texas, on June 19, 1865, that the state's residents finally learned that slavery had been abolished. The formerly enslaved people immediately began to celebrate with prayer, feasting, song, and dance. The following year, on June 19, the first official Juneteenth celebrations took place in Texas. Within a few years, African Americans in other states were celebrating the day as well, making it an annual tradition. Celebrations have continued across the United States into the 21st century. This year, Juneteenth is celebrated on Saturday, June 19, 2021. Juneteenth is the oldest nationally celebrated commemoration of the ending of slavery in the United States. Today, Juneteenth commemorates African American freedom and emphasizes education and achievement. It is a day, a week, and in some areas a month marked with celebrations, guest speakers, picnics and family gatherings. It is a time for reflection and rejoicing. It is a time for assessment, self-improvement and for planning the future."

"In cities across the country, people of all races, nationalities and religions are joining hands to truthfully acknowledge a period in our history that shaped and continues to influence our society today. Sensitized to the

conditions and experiences of others, only then can we make significant and lasting improvements in our society."

KUDOS to Central Park Explorers for making this initiative a massive success for a cause so important for so many!












Midland Public Schools' Summer Office Schedules


- © Elementary offices close for the summer June 17.
- Secondary school offices remain open during the summer months.
- June 14 through August 13: MPS employees who work year round will work four 10-hour days. District buildings are closed on Fridays during this time.
- Elementary offices will officially re-open August 2 for the 2021-22 school year.
- You are welcome to email and leave phone messages during the summer. Principals will be checking in during this time.



Summer eLearning Opportunity for High School Students

Once school has ended for the year, Midland Public Schools will again offer the Summer eLearning Program.

- → Initial Credit: Through this program, online courses are available to high school students who wish to earn initial credit in select courses.
- → Credit Recovery: If you are interested in Credit Recovery courses, please contact your building administration.
- → Quizzes & Tests: While being onsite is not a requirement for daily work or guizzes, tests and exams must be monitored. This can be by appointment onsite or by appointment virtually. Appointments will be scheduled with the teacher on duty between the hours of 9:00 and 12:00 Monday - Thursday, unless other arrangements are made.
- → Hours & Place: Students should expect to invest 45-60 hours to complete each course and may work on their course any place that they have an internet connection.
- → Dates: Courses will begin on June 14, 2021 and must be completed by August 12, 2021.
- → # of Courses: Students may only register for one course at a time.
- → Course Costs:
 - ⇒ Midland PS students: \$150 for Standard Edgenuity courses (EDG Edgenuity on course list); \$235 for Edgenuity Instructional Services courses (EDGIS - Edgenuity Instructional Services on course list)
 - ⇒ Non-Midland PS students: \$175—EDG and \$250—EDGIS
