The Michigan Child Protection Registry is a free do-not-contact service for Michigan's families.

Summer eLearning Opportunity — Once school has ended for the year, Midland Public Schools will once again offer the Summer eLearning Program. Through this program, online courses are available to high school students who wish to earn either initial credit or credit recovery in select courses. While these courses do not require students to attend classes daily, students must take all tests and exams onsite at the

PATHS Learning Center located in Midland High School. Students should expect to invest 45-60 hours to complete each course, but may work on their course any place that they have an internet connection. Courses will begin on June 17, 2019 and must be completed by August 15, 2019. Students may only register for one course at a time. The cost for each course is \$150 for Midland Public Schools' students, and \$175 for students outside of the MPS district.
