We are looking forward to the in-person return of our F2F Elementary and Middle School students for 10 days before the holiday break: December 9, 10, 11, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 21, 22

#### **January School Days, Semester Dates:**

Elementary, Middle and High School:

- ALL F2F and Virtual Students will resume instruction January 4
- 1st Semester Ends January 14, 2021
- 2nd Semester Begins January 19, 2021

#### High School Students:

- According to today's Governor/MDHHS COVID briefing, the
  pause in F2F learning for Michigan high schools has been
  extended for an additional 12 days—through December 20.
  As a result, MPS high schools will continue in virtual learning
  through December 22. We will await further guidance/updates
  from MDHHS and/or the Governor's Office.
- Midland PS will not administrator high school 1st semester exams. January 12-14 will be considered normal school days for students.

Does your child ride the Midland PS SCHOOL BUS to/ from school?

If so, this next announcement is IMPORTANT for YOUR FAMILY!

The district is excited to announce the roll out of a new Midland PS transportation app that will allow MPS parents to follow





their child(ren)'s buses. The app is called <u>Parent Portal Lite.</u> When students return for face-to-face instruction, letters will be sent home with students who ride MPS buses. Your child's letter will include a bus specific registration code just for his/her bus. If you have more than one child who attend different schools and ride different buses, you will receive a letter for each child, each with their buses' specific registration code. This app will allow parents to set up alert zones that will enable them to know when the bus is approaching their home and school.

Would you like to take a look at the app before we go back to F2F? If so, we are providing a registration code that will allow families to follow the food delivery buses on Tuesdays and Thursdays from now through January 15 between 10:45 & 12:45. The food service bus registration code is 47858280.

WHAT is being done?		
To perform an assessment of Micland Country's current broadband environment, the Committee will be conducting survey of local residents, businesses and other organizations across the country. WHEN will this take place?

#### The CDC recommends the following for those who travel during this time:

- "Consider getting tested with a <u>viral test</u> 3–5 days after your trip and reduce <u>non-essential activities</u> for a full 7 days after travel, even if your test is negative. If you don't get tested, consider reducing non-essential activities for 10 days.
- If your test is positive, <u>isolate</u> yourself to protect others from getting infected. Also take these actions for 14 days after you return from travel to protect others from getting COVID-19:
- <u>Stay at least 6 feet/2 meters</u> (about 2 arm lengths) from anyone who did not travel with you, particularly in crowded areas. It's important to do this everywhere — both indoors and outdoors.
- Wear a <u>mask</u> to keep your nose and mouth covered when you are in shared spaces outside of your home, including when using <u>public transportation</u>.
- If there are people in the household who did not travel with you, <u>wear a</u> <u>mask</u> and ask everyone in the household to wear masks in shared spaces inside your home.
- Wash your hands often or use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid being around people who are at <u>increased risk for severe illness</u>.
- Watch your health: Look for <u>symptoms</u> of COVID-19, and take your temperature if you feel sick."
