In the October 14 & 21 MPS Superintendent Communiques, we asked our stakeholders the following question in a onequestion poll,


"Are you in favor of MPS beginning school the Monday before Labor Day?"

WDYT ... BALANCED CALENDAR? YES OR NO

This poll was included in last week's Communique. If you had a chance to answer the one-question poll, THANK YOU! If not, we would like to know what you think. Please answer the one-question poll before the end of the day Wednesday (October 30).



- → Balanced calendars are often used to prevent summer learning loss
- The traditional model of nine months in class and three months of vacation with a few breaks has been changing
- → The traditional calendar was started over 100 years ago to match the agricultural industry
- → Lack of air conditioning has also been a reason that the traditional calendar has been
- → Some research indicates that the traditional calendar is broken and summer learning loss leads to weeks of re-teaching each school year and results in a full year or more of loss of academic growth by graduation
- → Traditional calendar and our state requires 180 days of instruction and 1098 hours of instruction
- → A balanced calendar spreads the same 180 days and 1098 hours of instruction over the entire year, resulting in more frequent breaks and a shorter summer break
- → Nearly all MPS classrooms now have AC and all would have AC before a balanced calendar could be adopted
- → Shorter breaks, often called "inter-sessions" allow for vacations and/or school or community partners to provide enrichment programming
- → Balanced calendars often align well with extra and co-curricular activities such as band & sports
- → Balanced calendars often have a 7-week summer vacation and begin school in mid-August
- → Optional inter-sessions are offered where students explore educational opportunities or take a break in October, February or May.



International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme Training: Learning and Growing Together



Last week, newly hired Midland Public Schools' elementary classroom and auxiliary teachers, current administrators, along with the district's PYP/STEM Coordinators and the Elementary Curriculum and Instructional Specialist, spent two and a half days exploring the foundational concepts of the Primary Years Programme. MPS hosted an IB-sponsored training entitled: *Making the PYP Happen: Implementing Agency*. IB Workshop leader, Erica Chiotti, organized the workshop



around the three main components of the PYP framework: The Learner, Learning and Teaching, and The Learning Community. Attendees had the opportunity to participate in a variety of engaging activities and explore multiple texts which enabled the group to better understand many of the essentials of the PYP, including: teaching through a conceptual lens, inquiry-based instruction, the Learner Profile, Approaches to Learning, and how to foster learner agency. The training allowed participants to experience
