COVID-19 (Coronavirus) — ** MPS CONTINUITY OF LEARNING PLAN **

Midland Public Schools, as required by Governor Whitmer's Executive Order 2020-35, has developed a Continuity of Learning Plan (CLP). The CLP outlines the District's plan for the delivery of instruction during the COVID-19 pandemic school closure. The delivery of instruction must begin by April 28, 2020 and continue through the end of the 2019-20 school year.

The development of this well-thought-out Plan is due to the incredibly hard work by a team of MPS administrators and educators led by MPS Associate Superintendent of Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment, Penny Miller-Nelson.

The MPS CLP has been developed and will start well before the April 28 deadline. We feel it is essential to meet our students' social/emotional and instructional needs as soon as possible. We fully expect the Continuity Learning Plan will be amended over the weeks ahead, as together we learn what is working well and what may need to be adjusted. CLP amendments are permitted under the Governor's Executive Order.

Starting Monday, April 13, 2020, our teachers will be connecting with students as a "soft start" to bring teachers, students and parents together to begin this new delivery model of instruction. By Monday, April 20, 2020, all teachers, students and parents will be moving forward in the curriculum to the best of everyone's ability. Please know that new curriculum will be presented during this model of instruction. In addition, the MPS CLP includes the wellbeing and social/emotional learning aspects as a major component.

The successful education of students has always consisted of a strong partnership between teacher, student, parents and community.
