### "Be Kind to Your Mind"

(Taken from the MDHHS Press Release)

Mental health experts at the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) are launching a statewide media campaign this week urging residents to seek relief from COVID-19-related emotional distress by talking to a trained crisis counselor and learning about other help available.



The "Be Kind to Your Mind" campaign promotes the use of Michigan's free, confidential Stay Well counseling line, and aims to combat stigma associated with seeking help for feelings of depression, anxiety, anger or loss – all common during a disaster like COVID-19. The Stay Well counseling line debuted on May 13, and is staffed with crisis counselors 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Callers can access the line by dialing Michigan's COVID-19 hotline at **888-535-6136 and pressing "8" at the prompt**. The service is part of a federally-funded grant program implemented by the MDHHS Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities Administration in partnership with the Michigan State Police. The window to move from virtual/hybrid to full F2F will be open for two weeks—November 9-23.



## The Midland PS Daily COVID-19 Numbers ... What do they tell us?

We are all living through very uncertain, frightening times right now. We are currently seeing a dramatic "uptick" in COVID numbers in our community, state and nation as well as for Midland Public Schools.



As a result, we have been receiving many questions, here are just a few:

- ⇒ What is the criteria and rules that MPS is following to send children home?
- Is MPS following the close contact definition?
- ⇒ Why did MPS buy all of the PPE, like desk shields? The #'s are skyrocketing!
- ⇒ Does MPS realize when they send a student home for 2-weeks, they are affecting the household financially?

We ask that you keep the following in mind when you go to the MPS website and see the District's daily COVID numbers jump up and down from day to day.

- ⇒ MPS receives a daily report directly from our dedicated, knowledgeable partners at the Midland County Department of Public Health. We take the close contact and positive cases directly from their daily report.
- ⇒ MPS & the Midland County Health Department are ABSOLUTELY following the CDC's definition of Close Contact (within 6 feet for 15 minutes or more).
- ⇒ Every family of an MPS student who is deemed to have been a close contact to a person who has tested positive will receive a phone call from their child's school.
- ⇒ As of last week, MPS has had only 13 cumulative students/staff who have tested positive for COVID since the beginning of the 2020-21 school year.
- ⇒ By far, the vast majority of MPS close contacts and positive cases are from student/staff interactions outside Midland Public Schools, which means the PPE, social distancing, masks, cleaning/sanitizing/air purifying measures while students and staff are within MPS walls are doing their job.
  - Here are just a few of the "outside interactions" that have been communicated to us from the Midland County Health Department: family gatherings like a wedding or special dinner, a child's parent in the same home, a group of adults participating in an inside team activity, students gathering at a classmate's home, among many others.

The key take-a-ways here to keep MPS students in F2F instruction ... be vigilant about masks, social distancing and hand washing; take COVID symptoms seriously; listen to our Health Dept. & Health Care professionals.

Social Emotional Learning (SEL) represents the set of skills your child needs to thrive throughout their life. SEL is commonly described by five core competencies: SOCIAL

- 1. self-awareness
- self-management
- 3. social awareness

responsible decision making.

**EMOTIONAL** LEARNING relationship skills Very simply put, SEL allows children and adults to

understand their own emotions and the emotions of others, and to use this understanding in their choices and relationships. While "SEL" has become a common buzz word among educators. social emotional learning does not just occur in the classroom; it is an important part of our homes, as well.



### MIDLAND PS NEEDS SUBSTITUTE **TEACHERS!**

This school year, MPS has about 60% of the number of substitute teachers we have in a traditional school year. That figure is probably not surprising giving the pandemic our world is currently facing.

This year, however, more than ever, MPS needs substitute teachers! Subs are needed to cover for the traditional reasons when a teacher must be out of a classroom, however, even more this year, for our District to continue F2F learning, it is essential that we have a good pool of guest teachers. As of November 1, the daily rate of pay for MPS substitute teachers was raised to \$100 per day or \$14.28 per hour.
