June has been designated Pride Month in honor of the LGBTQ+ community. Pride Month recognizes the long heritage of struggle as LGBTQ+ pioneers worked for civil rights and equal treatment. It is held in June to commemorate the Stonewall Uprising of 1969, a pivotal moment in the movement for LGBTQ+ civil rights. Pride Month celebrates a heritage of acceptance, love, and belonging within the LGBTQ+ community and their allies. Many cities all over the world celebrate Pride Month with parades, events and opportunities for education. This year, we choose to highlight Black LGBTQ+ icons in history who have blazed a trail for modern educators, authors and politicians. #### James Baldwin

James Baldwin was a novelist, essayist and civil rights activist who was born in New York, 1924. Baldwin is well known for his essays on being Black in America (*Notes of a Native Son*) and his work alongside Martin Luther King Jr. in the civil rights movement of the 1960s. His essays were



integral to the movement, especially 1963's *The Fire Next Time*, which offered White Americans a perspective of their culture from the Black American experience. James Baldwin's fiction works broke ground in their portrayal of LGBTQ+ and interracial relationships. Later in life, Baldwin became a college professor, teaching at University of Massachusetts Amherst and Hampshire College on race and American culture. He died in 1987.

#### Barbara Jordan



Barbara Jordan was an educator, an attorney, a civil rights leader and a political changemaker. She was born in 1936 in Houston, Texas. She was elected in 1966 to the Texas Senate as the first Black American, man or woman. Several years later, in 1972, she won election to Congress as the first woman and first Black American to represent Texas. She was the first Black Congressperson to represent the Deep

South. Jordan earned a seat on the House Judiciary Committee and helped to lead it during the Watergate scandals. The NAACP honored her in 1992 for her groundbreaking work in civil rights and political leadership, and in 1994 she was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom by Bill Clinton.

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# BOND AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS UNDERWAY THIS SUMMER

As you know, Bond funds have been



working hard since MPS taxpayers passed the 2.95 mills Bond in February 2015. Many very needed improvements have been made across the District in MPS buildings, the transportation fleet, technology, infrastructure & much more.

We currently have many facility projects underway this summer. Here are just a few updates:

- Worn out Community Stadium turf has been removed and the site is ready for installation when the new turf arrives in mid-July.
- ⇒ Community Stadium track re-seal will start soon.
- Middle school gym renovations are going well and are ahead of schedule.
- ⇒ Dow High HVAC units are being put in place and will be receiving controls this summer.
- ⇒ Franklin Center demo is complete and grounds will be re-seeded soon.
- ⇒ Final demo work at Eastlawn will be complete and grounds will be re-seeded soon.
- Midland High tennis courts are removed and are ready to be re-built in the next few weeks.
- ⇒ Cement work; resealing of parking lots nearing completion.
- ⇒ Transportation building roofing, doors, brick repair and painting completed.
- ⇒ NMS & JMS exterior electronic sign work is underway.
- ⇒ Brick staining is beginning at Midland High.

This is not an all-inclusive list, but provides a sense of progress.

## High School Summer eLearning Opportunity

As MPS has for many summers, now that the school year has ended, Midland Public Schools will offer the Summer eLearning **Program**. Through this program, online courses are available to



high school students who wish to earn either initial credit or credit recovery in select courses. While these courses do not require students to attend classes daily, student support will be provided by email, phone call or video chat. On-site support will become available based on State of Michigan recommendations but will not be required for daily work, guizzes or tests, however, exams must be monitored. Exams will be proctored onsite (when appropriate) or virtually by appointment. Students should expect to invest 45-60 hours to complete each course, but may work on their course any place that they have an internet connection. Courses began June 15, 2020 and must be completed by August 13, 2020. Students may only register for one course at a time. The cost for each course is \$150 for Midland Public Schools' students and \$175 for students outside of the MPS district. 
