- Cost: MPS Student, \$150 per standard Edgenuity course (EDG) and \$235 per Edgenuity IS (EDGIS) course; Non-MPS Student, \$250 per course.

- Payment is required to ensure enrollment.
- Online course credits count in a student's G.P.A.

Each eLearning course meets district requirements and state curriculum. Each lesson is taught virtually by a content certified instructor utilizing video lectures, web based reinforcement, vocabulary, instructional examples, guided practice, and assessment. Students always know their progress and work is graded instantly. Popular features include pausing and rewatching lectures, taking and using eNotes, reviewing and taking assessments until the material is mastered.

Students also have the additional support of an eLearning facilitator. This is an experienced certified teacher who provides student motivation, encouragement and support in developing the skills needed to navigate through their coursework.

One of the true benefits of online learning is having the flexibility of 24 hour course access anywhere a computer can access the Internet. Students should expect to invest a minimum of 45-60 hours to complete each course (students needing to retake assessments to achieve mastery will need significantly more time) and be present in the eLearning lab to take tests and the final exam. Upon enrollment, students will receive information regarding lab hours.

Students must take all tests and exams on-site – no assessments will be available to students at home.

Students are expected to complete their courses by August 13th.

Overview

Course Delivery: All courses are provided online.

Students with high speed internet computer connection may access their course anytime.

Courses:

Students should obtain course recommendations from their counselor prior to enrollment. There is a limit of 1 course enrollment at a time; students may start another course upon completion prior to July 12, 2021.*

Attendance: Best results are obtained when students work a total of 45-60 hours on their course.

Due to the nature of online learning, with the exception of tests and exams, students may work on their course any time, any place, any way, any pace.

Cost: MPS Students-\$150 per Edgenuity (EDG) and \$235 per Edgenuity Instructional Services (EDGIS) course. **Out of District Students-** \$175 per Edgenuity (EDG) and \$250 per Edgenuity Instructional Services (EDGIS) course.
